Window Weatherization & Repair Workshop is an intense & fun hands-on opportunity. Students will learn safe glass removal, glazing putty application, weather-stripping & sash re-installation which includes re-roping the sash weights. Participants will how to completely weatherize and repair a double-hung, wood window unit.</p> <p>In one day weatherize and repair 3 double hung window units from beginning to end. This creates a real opportunity for both learning and helping save original windows in a historic property. The weather stripping creates a track with a metal rib and all rails will get a rubber bulb type weather seal. Most windows will be one finger operation when completed and stop virtually all air infiltration.
