

Jessi Miller of the Frankfort Audubon Society will be presenting an introduction to backyard birding at the Paul Sawyier Library, Community Room in Frankfort (319 Wapping Street) on Wednesday February 4, from 6:30-7:30 pm. There is no cost and all are welcome.

GREAT BACKYARD BIRD COUNT

Friday, February 13, through Monday, February 16

The worldwide 2015 GREAT BACKYARD BIRD COUNT (GBBC) will take place Friday, Feb. 13, through Monday, Feb. 16. Frankfort Audubon Society will host bird counts on Friday at Juniper Hill, Saturday at Cove Spring Park, and Sunday at Fantasy Forest

GBBC is an annual event organized by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and the National Audubon Society that engages bird watchers of all ages in counting birds to create a real-time "snapshot" of where the birds are. Everyone is welcome - from beginning bird watchers to experts. It takes as little as 15 minutes on one day or count for as long as you wish each day of the event. It's free, fun, and easy. You can do it from your home, or go to a nearby park.

Participants tally the number of individual birds of each species they see during their count period and enter the observations on the GBBC website, powered by Ebird. Much more information is available about the Great Backyard Bird Count at the GBBC home page - Hhttp://gbbc.birdcount.org/H

- **Saturday 2/14 from 9-11am** Cove Spring wetland (meet at the wetland parking lot off US 127).
- Sunday 2/15 from 2:30-3:30 pm Fantasy Forest at the corner of E 2nd St and Logan St.

Christmas Bird Count Recap- December 14, 2014

Twenty observers spent 20.5 hours hours on foot (18.75 miles) and 13.5 hours in car (for 102 miles) and saw a total of 52 species (total individuals: 3843)! A couple of species not often seen in the Frankfort area in the winter were spotted including a loggerhead shrike and two bald eagles. The most common bird observed was the European Starling. Five different hawk species and eight different sparrow species were also counted. Thanks to Peggy Gould for coordinating this!

Bird Site updates

- Peter W. Pfeiffer State Fish Hatchery is now open. It is off Highway 127, 7.7 miles N of Cove Spring, right onto Hwy 2919, 1.8 miles. Over 30 hatchery ponds provide for ducks, geese and herons and when drained provide for shorebirds as well. This is a good spot to see bald eagles all winter.
- At Buckley Wildlife Sanctuary, the red and yellow trails are currently closed for cleanup. The ash trees have been hit by the emerald ash bore and are being removed from the property. The blue and white trails are still open, and most importantly for birders, the bird blind is open. This bird blind is frequented by White-crowned sparrows of different ages, so is a good spot to see the plumage variation.
